National Curriculum 2016-17

A high-quality physical education curriculum inspires all pupils to succeed and excel in competitive sport and other physically demanding activities. It should provide opportunities for pupils to become physically confident, in a way, which supports their health and fitness. Opportunities to compete in sport and other activities build character and help to embed a 'values led' education.

Aims

The national curriculum for physical education aims to ensure that all pupils:

- develop competence to excel in a broad range of physical activities
- are physically active for sustained periods of time
- engage in competitive sports and activities
- lead healthy, active lives.

Vision and Aim

As a staff at Haversham School we want the children to see that PE and sport are at the heart of school life and that they can achieve anything if they take the opportunities offered to them.

We echo the aims and purpose as stated in the new National Curriculum. We believe physical education and sport is an essential part of every child's development.
