Pupil Premium (Disadvantaged Grant) - What is it?

The Disadvantaged Grant is a grant which is allocated to schools to support disadvantaged children on FSM register. The Pupil Premium Grant for 2012 - 2013 was allocated to local authorities and schools with pupils on roll in January 2012 that are known to be eligible for free school meals (FSM) at any time in the last six years. Each of these pupils attracts a specific amount of funding. Schools have the freedom to spend the grant, which is additional to the underlying schools budget, in a way they think will best support the raising of attainment for the most vulnerable pupils.

Why is it important?

At Haversham Village School the Pupil Premium is focused on raising attainment. Attainment and achievement are closely tracked throughout the school. The performance of individual pupils and groups are very closely monitored to ensure that no one person or group is underachieving.

The School Development Plan clearly identifies the annual priorities which are the focus to take the school forward. It highlights priorities and shows how they are to be achieved. Raising standards is a constant focus and it is within this planning structure that pupil premium expenditure is targeted. Pupils who meet the criteria are supported through additional resources to achieve maximum impact on their attainment and achievement.
